Participation.... work to be done!






Water Polo in the West.... additional resources required!

For some time, it has been our aspiration to develop water polo beyond the Greater Belfast area in in particular West of the Bann. Despite successful adoption of water polo by Clubs outside of Belfast, in Newry, Lisburn, Bangor and Portadown, the West of Ulster remains a water polo development opportunity yet to be grasped.

Developing water polo West of the Bann, will require substantial resources in terms of Officer time and other resources. Unfortunately, such resources are not available to us currently, however we have chosen to include this development project within our 2022/25 Development Plan to demonstrate our commitment to spreading our sport throughout Ulster, and we remain hopeful that perhaps the required resources may become available during the lifetime of this strategy.


Delivery...how we are going to do it!
